

The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP) in Michigan

TEFAP participation eligibility* is based on that the household meets the income guidelines (below), or a household member participates in Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP), Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC), Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR), Supplemental Food Assistance Program (SNAP), and/or Supplemental Security Income (SSI), or contains a student with an approved free or reduced-price school meals application, or has an individual need for emergency food.

* Participants must provide their name, number of people in household, state of residency, and eligibility. Any additional information collected is self-declared and will not affect TEFAP Eligibility.
